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Passenger Rail

After its demise in 2005 due to damage caused by Hurricane Katrina, the return of passenger rail has been a constant topic. Recently, there has been attempts jump start the conversations again with the restoration of service from New Orleans to Mobile in early 2025. Local officials have lobbied both state and federal officials to encourage them to begin looking at restoring service to provide additional transportation options as well as encourage economic development and promote tourism. The CRTPA will continue to monitor these efforts.
